# LOOKING TOWARD THE FUTURE Ed Hawes '76, Chapter Advisor Chair

Autumn has returned with beautiful fall Indiana weather and optimism in the air around the chapter and on campus. Hopefully, we are on the tail end of the COVID pandemic as students, staff and alumni look forward to a wonderful 2021-2022 school year.

This fall we had 54 members move back into the chapter house since reopening three years ago including our first senior live-in, Andrew LaValle. The 54 number is due to COVID occupancy restrictions at 75% occupancy when the spring semester ended. Our goal is to have 78 members (100% occupancy) living in our chapter house by fall 2022. The loss of 25+ live-ins has significantly impacted our financial reserves, but the House Corp and our Advisory team along with support from the Phi Kappa Psi Foundation have worked hard to launch an Annual Giving Fund to provide our chapter long-term financial stability.

Our chapter's leadership is nearing their annual term and a new team will soon be taking the leadership helm to continue our impressive progress over the past five years since recolonizing. The team of Jake Cleff (GP), Jake Zaslow (VGP), Jacob Vrankin (VGP), and Tim Fasick (Treasurer), combined with really enthusiastic committee chairs and members who have made significant strides in terms of reaching our chapter goals. We are excited for the next executive team to carry the baton to greater chapter success.

Indiana Beta's undergraduate leadership has developed a strategic plan known as the Six Pillars for Success and last semester implemented a performance management program to track member engagement and chapter impact. The Six Pillars for Success include: Academics; Brotherhood; Philanthropy/Community Service; Campus Leaderships; Athletics and Social. We have seen semester-over-semester improvement in all six areas with results also contributing to building a stronger brotherhood culture. Members are reminded of Indiana Beta's storied culture of excellence in all we do, *The Great Joy of Serving Others*, campus leadership, academic performance, and athletic success. Fall events for philanthropic and campus service programs are in action including a Lacrosse All-Campus Fundraiser that was successful. Brothers continue to take on a variety of campus leadership roles recognizing the value they offer in terms of improving employment opportunities.

The chapter has also participated in alumni mentoring programs where over 30 Phi Psi alumni and undergraduates participated in networking and career advice. Several summer internships and full time offers have been generated and accepted. Also, Sam Wertz, Historian, was elected by district peers this summer to serve as District Archon III over the next two years and participate in the 2022 GAC in Indianapolis.

Our chapter is growing and thriving once again based on Phi Psi Indiana Beta principles that have served the chapter well for many decades.
